Center for Social Justice Initiatives

Thanks to you, the CSJ has grown tremendously in the past year. In addition to our critical social justice programming, we are grateful to be able to provide, for the first time, the following in-house pro bono initiatives:

Sealing and Expungement Initiative: The CSJ has partnered with local nonprofits, community members, grassroots organizers and cannabisindustry players to launch an ongoing sealing and expungement racial and economic justice initiative intended to address the harms caused to people of color from the war on drugs. On September 30, 2020, and April 29, 2021, we hosted Know Your Rights events for the public and provided pro bono assistance to those who wanted legal help. At our spring event, every participant was able to receive assistance, including obtaining a copy of their CORI report, one-on-one consultation with an attorney, preparation of and help filing Petitions to Seal and/or Expunge, and brief legal advice. Our legal volunteers were trained by recent Adams Award winner and Access to Justice Fellow Crispin Birnbaum. This virtual event proved to be incredibly complex and ultimately was very successful. We could not have done it without the assistance of our community partners, members of the private bar, law students, and volunteers from Mass Mutual, along with our event sponsors (listed below).

<u>Virtual Court User Experience Survey/Observation Project</u>: A cutting-edge observation/research-based project in which the CSJ and Suffolk University Professor Benjamin Golden worked with student volunteers over winter break and spring term to understand the challenges and successes of virtual Zoom court from a self-represented litigant perspective. Volunteers observed virtual court sessions, recorded data, interviewed litigants, and contributed to a report being drafted by the Massachusetts Appleseed Center for Law and Justice that will attempt to change policy and practice by judges and magistrates across the state.

Last year, CSJ volunteers completed more than 3,605 hours!!! This equates to almost \$750,000 in free legal services provided.

Consumer Debt Initiative (CDI): Over 50% of people in Hampden County neighborhoods of color have a debt in collection, and Springfield has the highest volume of debt cases across the state in our courts. In addition, the outcome of a debt collection proceeding has a significant impact on a person's ability to get loans, rent an apartment, and provide for their family. The CDI, funded by the MassMutual Foundation as part of its Live Mutual Project, is the CSJ's busiest program in which volunteers assist defendants facing wrongful credit card collection actions in virtual Small Claims Zoom sessions at the Springfield District Court every Friday.

CDI volunteers fight for justice against the powerhouse debt collection industry while helping clients understand their legal rights and connecting them to financial literacy and other holistic resources. Among other things, volunteers attend court, conduct client intakes, negotiate settlements, seek dismissals based on economic hardship of the defendants and even go to "trial" in a small claims hearing when needed.

This initiative has served an impressive **223** defendants since the courts reopened virtually in late September **2020** (seven months' time).

<u>The Cost of Gun Violence in Springfield:</u> this project examines the cost of gun violence in our city in collaboration with a local activist group, Greater Springfield Nonviolence. Our research will generate a proposal to the city council and mayor asking for changes in the allocation of anti-violence funds.

Racial Justice Sentencing Project(s): the CSJ has joined in partnership with both CPCS and several private Children and Family Law attorneys to explore the issue of racially disparate sentencing outcomes and court involvement for people of color in our community. These projects are largely data-driven and research-based, and also involve drafting a forthcoming report of findings and recommendations for change.

Addressing Racism as a Social Determinant of Health through Restorative Racial Healing Dialogue: the CSJ was awarded a Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belonging grant by Health New England to pilot a two-part program, launching this summer, designed to (1) educate the WNEU community about the connection between racism and health disparities, as well as the structural barriers to equity that exist across society; and (2) facilitate racial healing and relationship-building between and among our institution and the local community through restorative justice healing circle conversations.

Independent Pro Bono Project: students are always welcome to pursue pro bono projects independently with the CSJ. In the past year, we hosted several students researching pipeline initiative best practices, as well as diversity, equity and inclusion projects.
