OTD - As per the recently approved COPHS bylaws, during 2019-2020, a new OTD Curriculum Committee was started. Initial activities included the appointment of members and the election of a chair, development of new OTD Curriculum Committee Policies and Procedures, self-study by Committee members on Curriculum review strategies and practices at WNE COPHS, and other institutions, development of a course review system and initial review of courses. Interrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic, the Committee activities are on hold until next month when they are expected to resume. The plan for Committee activities, from August 2020 until May 2021, is to complete reviews of all courses in the OTD curriculum, complete and update OTD curriculum mapping as it applies to curriculum review, survey faculty and students about the OTD curriculum strengths and suggestions for change, all of which contribute to the overall curriculum review.

Pharmacy- Removal of PHAR 515 Pharmaceutics I Lab. This change was done upon review of existing learning objectives and previous fall and spring lab courses. It was determined the outcomes required could be accomplished with one lab (Spring Pharmaceutics II Lab). This also lightened the PY1 fall semester which was a heavy workload for students.

The Doctoral Experiential Student Group has developed literature reviews and proposals for studying best practices in developing and running university and college clinics. The students are focused on developing an Occupational Therapy clinic on the WNE campus that will provide services to the WNE community and the local community, while providing opportunities for hands-on education and integration into the OTD curriculum at all levels. The students completed research projects in preparation for their Doctoral Experiential projects that focused on identifying populations who would benefit from a University clinic at WNE. Student projects were focused on mental health needs of college students, accessibility of mental health services in Hampden County, and reimbursement and early discharge trends across occupational therapy settings. The students are working on plans to collaborate with Springfield Technical Community College to develop a mutually beneficial relationship where we will learn from each other about how to operate a successful college/university clinic.

Class of 2021 – AY19-20 Fall & Spring – UMass Health Center, Amherst, MA & Caring Health Center, Springfield, MA

The Doctoral Experiential Student Group developed proposals/literature reviews for studying the introduction of occupational therapy into Primary Care settings. The students focused on populations and health conditions that are prevalent in Primary Care practice: the impact of the post-partum period on occupational performance; sexual education/health issues for college-aged students; interprofessionalism as a model of practice; and behavioral health management in the college-aged population. The students developed/administered an interview that was used to obtain demographic and practice data from Primary Care providers, analyzed the data, and will complete a paper/presentation to submit to a professional conference.

Class of 2020 – AY19-20 Summer Session – Baystate Medical Center, Springfield, MA

The Doctoral Experiential student group is utilizing a consultation/educational model to assist an interprofessional team (occupation therapists and a nurse) to further the development of an on-going research initiative on falls prevention; initiate the development of training materials for building cultural competency in the Baystate provider community; and support the inclusion of occupational therapy in the development of telehealth programming. The students will create an e-portfolio to document the process of planning and implementing this experiential project.

Graves Wheeler L

Faculty Mentor for the Class of 2020 and 2021 Doctoral Experiential Courses/Student Groups.

Class of 2021 – AY19-20 Fall & Spring – The Woods Agawam, MA and Loomis Lakeside Springfield, MA

Dementia care focused group. Projects include the design of a sensory room and traveling sensory cart to address psychosocial needs of Dementia residents as well as caregiver training of the use and implementation of both. Development of transition protocol into a secure dementia unit to be used with transitions from within the current building to the secure unit and direct admits to the secure unit. Development of include dementia care programing focusing on the just right challenge as well the use of occupation based programing. The final project is in relation to the use of animal assisted programing and therapy.

Class of 2020 – AY19-20 Summer Session – Glenmeadow Retirement Community, Longmeadow, MA

Dementia care focused group. Projects include the use of digital memory books for orientation both to person and for facility caregivers and residents. The use of home safety assessments for both move in and throughout the aging in place process. The importance of nutrition in the care of the older dementia residents including the use of assessments for preferences and recommendations for nutrition with focus on stages of dementia. The use of occupation based activities as well as the use of staging to provide the just right challenge with all task participation.

Class of 2021 – AY19-20 Fall & Spring – Single-Handed Solutions, Springfield, MA; The Handsmart Group (international); and Handspring Clinical Services, Middletown, NY

The Doctoral Experiential Student Group developed proposals/literature reviews for studying telehealth delivery of occupational therapy service to design and implement innovative programs. The students focused on health conditions that are relevant to subpopulations of individuals with upper limb acquired loss or congenital difference. The students created/administered interviews with practitioners already engaged in telehealth to develop an on-site telehealth center at WNEU. They will utilize this center next summer when they implement expanded versions of the *Unlimb*ed Wellness program on a national, and potentially international level, evaluate the program and complete a paper/presentation to submit to a professional conference.

Class of 2020 – AY19-20 Spring and Summer Session – Agape for Global Health, Boston, MA

The Doctoral Experiential student group is working with an international health organization to provide needed health care and educational supports to families in Haiti. Students are conducting interviews and working with volunteers to surveys to further the development of funding support, training materials, and resources for existing programs such as water filtration, hypertension prevention, menstruation kits, prenatal care, and cultural competency, as well as in the development of new programs such as COVID19 education and telehealth programming. The students will use e-portfolio to document the process of planning, implementing and evaluating this experiential project and complete a paper/presentation to submit to a professional conference.

Faculty mentor for the class of 2020 and 2021 Doctoral Experiential Courses/Student Groups.

Class of 2021 – AY19-20 Fall and Spring – The four students with whom I worked were focused on two projects: one student worked with her doctoral site, Autism/Asperger Network (AANE), to complete a program evaluation using their client database and the other group of three worked on developing programming ideas for Hampshire Hope (a consortium of opioid addiction agencies). The doctoral experiential courses for fall and spring this academic year, in coordination with the research methods series, involved performing literature reviews relevant to projects of interest of their site mentors and completing a research project related to their subject matter. The student who worked with AANE completed an evaluation of the success of clients in accomplishing the goals set and the competency of coaches in setting measurable goals and completing documentation. The other student group completed a survey and analysis of vaping use on campus and its impact and presented the findings to Dean Hart-Steffes. The students who did the project about vaping also submitted a proposal to present their findings at the fall Massachusetts Association of Occupational Therapy meeting.

Class of 2020 – AY 20 Spring/Summer Session – Hampshire Hope, Northampton, MA.
The Doctoral Experiential student group is using a consultation/educational model to assist an interprofessional team (social workers, community health workers, administrators of organizations related to opioid addiction) to investigate restorative justice programs and programs addressing suicidality among those with substance use difficulties. These projects involve literature reviews, relevant data collection from local and state presentations, and recommendations for pilot project design and implementation within the consortium. The students will also complete an e-Portfolio of all of their work at the end of the experiential.

Class of 2021 – AY19-20 Fall & Spring

The Doctoral Experiential Student Group has studied the effects of manual therapy techniques and their prevalence on work-place injuries of therapists in an outpatient setting. A survey was developed and administered to manual therapists (OTs, and PTs) in the local area. The objective of this IRB-approved phenomenological study was to identify activities and other risk factors to limit the likelihood of work-related manual therapist acquired injuries. Students have recently submitted proposals to both the 2020 Massachusetts OT Association State Conference and the 2021 American Occupational Therapy National Conference on their study findings.

Class of 2020 – AY19-20 Summer Session

The Doctoral Experiential student group is utilizing a consultation/educational model to provide materials to the Jewish Community Center (Longmeadow, MA) on techniques and alternative options to manage arthritic and musculoskeletal pain. Students have also applied to the WNEU IRB to trial non-traditional topical analgesic treatments (magnesium oil, hemp cream, etc.) on community-dwelling adults with musculoskeletal pain. The resultant information from the trial will be given to other health professionals (ATI rehab) who provide interventional treatment to this population. The students are also creating an e-portfolio to document the process of planning and implementing this experiential project during the course of their 14 week Doctoral Experiential.

Of the 47 students who began pre-pharmacy in the fall of 2018, 13 students (27.7%) qualified for the early decision cohort admissions interview [based upon pre-pharmacy GPA and course grades following year one]. Of these 13 students, 9 met the application requirements for the early decision cohort to receive his/her guaranteed interview. All of these students were accepted to the Pharm.D. program, and all accepted the offer of admission.

Among the 38 students in the pre-pharmacy cohort that started fall 2018 who did not apply early decision:

- 4 were eligible to apply early decision and elected to apply regular decision; all were accepted to the Pharm.D. program, and 3 (75.0%) accepted the offer of admission; the one student who declined admission is no longer pursuing a career in pharmacy
- 16 were ineligible to apply early decision and applied regular decision; all were accepted to the Pharm.D. program (one of which withdrew and is no longer pursuing pharmacy), and 2 have active offers of admission (but have not yet paid an admissions deposit).
- 1 did not apply to the Pharm.D. program and is attending the University of Connecticut pharmacy program
- 1 remained in the pre-pharmacy program but did not apply to the Pharm.D. program
- 16 changed majors or withdrew from the University

The Doctor of Pharmacy program received 7 applications from WNE students who were never enrolled in the pre-pharmacy program. Of these 7 students, all were interviewed; all were admitted to the program, and all accepted the offer of admission.

The Doctor of Occupational Therapy program received 74 applications for admission for the incoming Class of 2023. Two applications were from WNE students; both students were admitted to the program and accepted the offer of admission.
