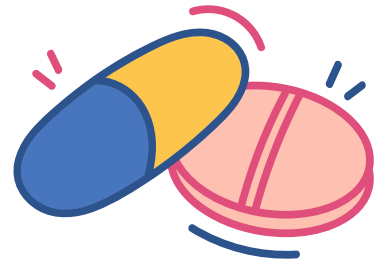

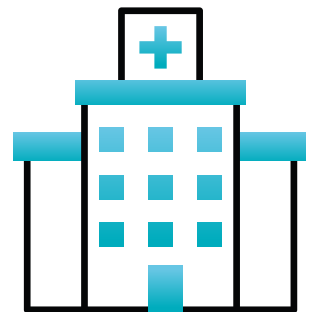
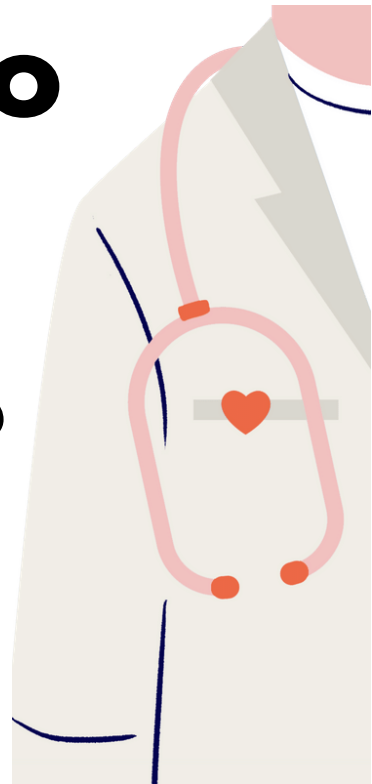


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REASONS TO PURSUE A CAREER IN HEALTHCARE

EARN A GOOD SALARY

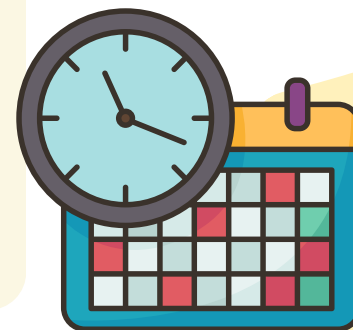
The average entry-level healthcare worker can make from \$15-\$50 per hour. The more experience, the more money you can make.

BETTER OPPORTUNITY

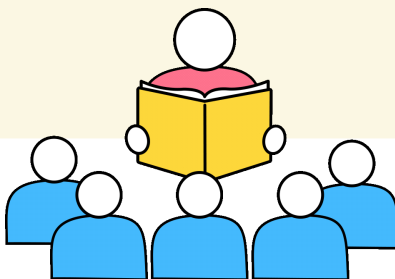
Going to college gives us the opportunity to get better and more paying jobs. Every good-paying job out there requires some level of educational qualifications.

FULL POTENTIAL

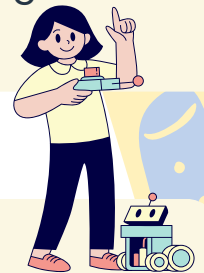
We attend college to help us to develop to the fullness of our potential. Without educational development, we are likely to perform below our potential.

TIPS TO STRENGTHEN YOUR APPLICATION

START EARLY

EARN GOOD GRADES

Good grades are a great way to stand out when college admissions look at your applications. Getting a high test score in ACT / SAT also helps in schools that consider standardized tests. Study hard, do the best in class and get the highest grade you can.

APPLY EARLY

Making your application stand out and getting in front of decision-makers sooner by applying to the college of your choosing in the early is why you should make every effort to submit all of your application/materials well in advance.

GET INVOLVED IN VOLUNTEERING

The act of service in the community shows your desire to support and assist those in need. Many opportunities are available to you in your community such as the pet shelter, hospital, tutoring or Red Cross.

GOOD LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

Start by asking your favorite teacher for a letter. If he or she seems too busy or, ask another, until you find who is very excited to write you with a letter. This way, you're more likely to get a letter that conveys such enthusiasm about you.

PERSONAL ESSAY

Write about something that is very writing about something that's close to your heart and give it some thought. Before deciding on the final draft, it is sometimes be useful to create multiple drafts of your essay. A friend or instructor could be a good person to have look over your personal essay before you submit it with your application.

WHAT IS FINANCIAL AID?

Financial aid is money that is given or lent to students in order to help pay for their education.

HOW MUCH MONEY WILL I GET?

Financial aid is determined by the financial aid office at the university or college you are going to attend.

WHO CAN RECEIVE FINANCIAL AID?

Most students can receive financial aid. However, there are requirements that have to be met. Some requirements can include that an individual has financial need, is a U.S citizen or eligible noncitizen, and is enrolled in an eligible degree.

CAN I ONLY RECEIVE FINANCIAL AID ONE TIME?

Luckily, the answer to this question is no. A student can potentially receive financial aid for up to **6 YEARS!**

DO I HAVE TO PAY FINANCIAL AID BACK?

The type of financial aid you receive depends if you need to pay it back or not. Some types of financial aid do have to be paid back. However, some types of financial aid do not! Grants, scholarships, and work-study money does **NOT** have to be repaid.

WHAT IS A COLLEGE ESSAY?

Almost all colleges require students to write a college essay as part of the application process. The college essay is a personal statement, containing a personal strength, hardship, achievement, or something unique, which will allow you to stand out from others in the eyes of the admissions office.

WHAT TO WRITE ABOUT?

Some options for essay topics include the following:

- A personal hardship
- Hobby
- A personal strength
- A unique perspective on a specific situation
- Personal experience

BE AUTHENTIC & GRAB THE READER FROM THE START

A college essay is the time for the student to give the admissions office a personal view into their life. Be authentic with the topic you are writing about and never make up any false information. Grabbing the reader's attention right at the beginning of the essay will make you stand out from other applicants.

WRITE SEVERAL DRAFTS & PROOFREAD

Compose multiple drafts of the essay before submitting it to colleges and start writing it several months before the due date. This will give you time to write the draft, set it aside for a few days, then go back and revise. It is also very important to read the essay aloud or have another individual read it. Another individual can help with any grammatical mistakes or can make sure it makes sense to someone other than the writer.

Student Success Center:

The Student Success Center (SSC) promotes academic success, enriches students' academic experience, and encourages student development. Services range from **Peer Tutoring** to **Academic Progress Monitoring** to providing students with **new study strategies** and **time management skills**. The SSC staff works to create a supportive learning environment in which students can develop the skills needed to achieve their academic goals while being held accountable for their own progress.

Peer Advising

Peer Advising is a part of the First Year Program where upper class students assist incoming students with their transition to the University both academically and socially. This is valuable both for incoming students and the Peer Advisors, as many skills are acquired throughout the intense training process to become a Peer Advisor.

Library Resources

Current WNE students with ID may also access the basement level 24x7 via the parking lot entrance. We are the drug experts, and healthcare professionals such as doctors and nurses look towards us for any of their drug related questions!

WHY CHOOSE THE PHARMD PROGRAM?

Being in the Doctor of Pharmacy program will engage your critical thinking skills and you will use them to help patients in real life scenarios. The program has a maximum of 75 students each year, which means your professors will know your name and take a personal interest in your success here at WNE!

WHAT TO EXPECT

The Doctor of Pharmacy program is a 6 year program, but trust me, it will go by fast! You will have 4 years of undergraduate, where you can get your Bachelor's in Science, then 2 more years of graduate studies. Did I mention pharmacists can make anywhere from 130,000-170,000\$ a year?

Occupational therapists are healthcare professionals that help patients be able to function and fulfill their daily routines and roles. Occupational therapists often work with patients that have disabilities and help them so that the patient can live independently.

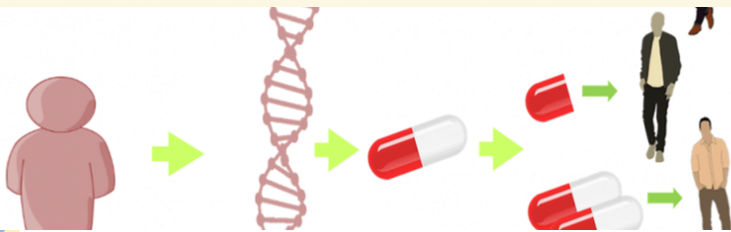

Are you interested in working in a lab and conducting research or possibly work in the industry of health care?

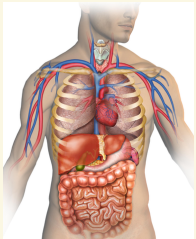
A degree in Pharmaceutical Sciences can help personalize your career goals.

Areas of Interest

- Pharmacology - the study of drugs
- Biomedical- the study of human health
- Pharmacoeconomics - discusses the cost of health care
- Pharmacogenomics- study of personalized medicine based on our genetics

Program Specific Activities

Research involves studying and investigating to seek out knowledge that is new or supports an already known fact. Both Master's programs have research classes for students to complete.

To receive a Master's in Pharmaceutical Sciences specifically a thesis is required which is a research paper that discusses a specific topic and is completed by the end of your final semester.



PROGRAM SPECIFIC ACTIVITIES: DOCTOR OF PHARMACY

A few specific activities along with courses are requirements in the process of pursuing a Doctor of Pharmacy degree (PharmD). These activities are to support students with a better understanding of the profession.

1

TRAINING:



- Immunization
 - This training provides students with knowledge of different type of vaccines for all ages and populations.
 - examples: Flu, COVID, and Tdap.
- Naloxone
 - This training provides students with the knowledge of saving the life of someone experiencing an opioid overdose.
 - examples: Narcan spray

2

Community service:

- 80 hours; 20 hours each year.
 - Examples of services are flu clinics, drug take-back day, assistance living cleaning, soup kitchen and volunteering at a church, school or hospital.
 - Get all hours signed off by the person or organization running that volunteer event.

3

Pharmacy practice experiences:

- Three introductory pharmacy practice experiences (IPPE)
 - Students gain direct experience with healthcare professions in both community and hospital settings.
- Six advanced pharmacy practice experiences (APPE)
 - Six clinical rotations (36 weeks total) where students gain experience with more specific topics (i.e. ambulatory care) alongside the community setting.



4

Labs:

- Sterile Lab
 - This lab provides students with the basic understanding of working in a pharmacy at hospital setting, where they can learn how to make IV bags and utilize a method known as “aseptic technique” (complete sterility).
- Patient Assessment Skills Lab
 - This lab engages students in regards to interacting with patients to promote selfcare in a outpatient setting.



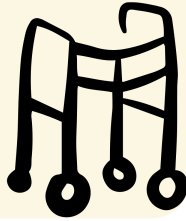
PROGRAM SPECIFIC ACTIVITIES: DOCTOR OF OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

WHAT DOES THE PROGRAM CONSIST OF?

The program for occupational therapy combines in person learning with on-site practice experience. This gives learners the opportunity to practice their skills in real life scenarios.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

- Level I Fieldwork
- Level II Fieldwork
- Doctoral Experiential Capstone

4

LEVEL II FIELDWORK

Similar to level I, students work in different practice settings. However, now the students are able to choose their location and remain there for a longer duration (12 weeks). This gives students a more independent role as they work alongside practicing occupational therapists.

3

LEVEL I FIELDWORK

Every semester, students are able to go into the community and apply what they have learned. Working in sites such as hospitals, senior living facilities, schools, and more.

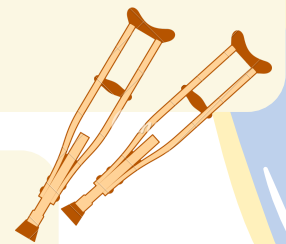

CAPSTONE PROJECT

The capstone project helps to develop advanced skills in 2 separate phases.

Phase 1: Preparatory phase; designing of a research project.

Phase 2: Experiential/Scholarship phase; implementing project and reporting on outcomes.



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
