

## Accommodation for Audio Recording in the Classroom Student Agreement Form

Students eligible for classroom audio recording as an accommodation based on a disability are approved as a means to ensure equal access to information obtained from classroom lectures, both interactive and passive modes. Audio recordings are only for the purpose of the student gaining access to their learning environment. No portion of the recorded lecture may be shared or reproduced in any way without the consent of the lecturer. The recording may not be posted online.

Students approved for audio recording as a reasonable accommodation are required to read and sign the following agreement:

### Legal Precedent

Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (*34 C.F.R. Part 104.44b*) states:

(b) *Other rules.* A recipient to which this subpart applies may not impose upon handicapped students other rules, such as the prohibition of tape recorders in classrooms or of dog guides in campus buildings that have the effect of limiting the participation of handicapped students in the recipient's education program or activity.
